Exciting Pollinator Facts Fortune teller

1. Cut out the square above.
2. Fold the paper from corner to corner, making a triangle
3. Fold the triangle from corner to corner, making a smaller triangle.
4. Unfold
5. Colored side down, fold the four corners to the center of the square (where the x crosses).
6. Flip paper over.
7. Fold the four corners to the center of the square (where the x crosses).
8. Fold and unfold the bottom edge of the square up to the top.
9. Fold and unfold the left edge of the square over to the right.
10. Push the four corners of your square into the center and then slide 4 fingers into the flaps of your fortune teller. Count out the letters of the selected pollinator as you open and close the teller.
